Directorate of Military Operations and Planning fonds. - 6 m of textual records. - 1942-1965.

Administrative History

The Directorate of Military Operations and Planning (DMO&P) was a predecessor of the Directorate of International Plans (DI Plans). It was responsible to the Army's Chief of General Staff. By the mid 1960's, when the entire structure of Canada's armed forces was being re-evaluated and re-organized, DMO&P was absorbed into a tri-service directorate - the Directorate of International Plans - a sub-division of the Canadian Forces Headquarters, responsible to the Vice-Chief of the Defence Staff.

Scope and Content

Fonds consists of files from the Directorate of Military Operations and Planning. Files mainly consist of meeting minutes, memoranda, draft reports and proposed amendments. There are also defence plans and research papers from Canada and NATO. The majority of the documents evaluate the Soviet threat during the Cold War, and focus on security and military preparations in response to rising tensions. The files are arranged in numerical order according to the file numbers created by the Central Registry system. There are 17 series:

Other Notes

- In 1950 National Defence Headquarters physically consolidated all the records operations under one organization, the Directorate of Central Registries. The three armed services and the Defence Research Board, maintained their own central registries within this structure, but a new registry was added to cover the administrative and operational activities that concerned all of the department. In effect, the Administration Central Registry were the records of Deputy Minister of National Defence, who was responsible for overall departmental administration, which included the continuing review of, and control over, the financial aspects of operations, logistics, personnel and administration. It has been replaced by the Defence Subject Classification and Disposition System (DSCDS).
- The files in Series 16 are filed under 85/320 in the Document Collection and the files in Series 17 are filed under 112.3M2 (D570) in the Kardex Collection.

Series 1: Advisory Committee on Northern Development – Interdepartmental Committee
Textual records in Boxes 7, 8, 16 and 23. - 1950-1962.

Administrative History

The Advisory Committee on Northern Development was established in 1948. This interdepartmental Committee dealt with the administration implications of defence activities in the north. It advised the Government on questions of policy relating to civilian and military undertakings in Northern Canada in order to provide for the effective coordination of all Government activities in that area. It reported to Ministers and to the Cabinet Defence Committee, as appropriate. The Committee held its last meeting in 1971.

Series Description

Series contains files on infrastructure development in the North, which was done to better equip the region to respond to enemy threats. Topics include Canadian sovereignty over Arctic waters and Soviet economic aspects in the North. Includes meeting agendas and minutes from the Advisory Committee on Northern Development. Also contains annual government reports on Northern Canada such as: Progress Report on Federal Government’s Building Programme in Northern Canada, Proposed Building Programme in Northern Canada, and Report on Army Activities in the North.

Series Description

Series 3: Canada-USA Military Cooperation

Textual records in Boxes 2, 11, 15, 17-18, 21-22, 24 and 30. - 1948-1964.

Series Description

Series consists of files from the Canada-USA Military Cooperation Committee, as well as those from the sub-committee on Mapping and Charting. Documents discuss joint efforts between Canada and the United States to develop defence plans for North America, including security plans, the Distant Early Warning line, and aerial monitoring projects. Files mainly consist of meeting minutes, memoranda, as well as draft reports and agreements.

There are 3 sub-series:

Sub-series 1: Canada-USA Military Cooperation Committee

Textual records in Boxes 15, 17, 22 and 30. - 1948-1964.

Administrative History

The Canada-United States Military Cooperation Committee (CANUS MCC) was formed in 1946 and manages cooperation at the military planning level. It provided the primary military staff linkage between Canada and the United States. The mission of the MCC was to develop and coordinate CANUS area military defence planning. The Canadian Chief of the Defence Staff and the United States Joint Chiefs of Staff designated the MCC to be the primary military staff agency for recommending and coordinating CANUS defence planning. The Canadian and United States MCC Chairmen were responsible to the Chief of the Defence Staff and the Joint Chiefs of Staff, respectively, and acted jointly on their behalf. More recently, the MCC was called upon to revise the North American Air Defence Command (NORAD) Terms of Reference, develop a new Canada-U.S. Basic Security Document and to form a binational Space Cooperation Working Group to examine areas for enhanced joint space endeavours.

Subseries Description

Sub-series includes various files from the Canada-USA Military Cooperation Committee. Topics include the Canada-USA Basic Security Plan, Canadian Army operating requirements in the United States, rules of engagement for unidentified submarines, and air defence objective plans. Also includes files from the Meteorological Sub-Committee, which examined the impact of weather events on North American defence plans. The majority of the files consist of meeting minutes, memoranda, draft reports and proposed amendments to reports.

Sub-series 2: General Files

Subseries Description

Sub-series consists of files on Canada and the United States' joint efforts to develop security plans and warning systems to defend North America against enemy threats. Files consist mainly of reports, charts and draft agreements which assess the threat and discuss ways in which Canada and the United States could collaborate to protect North America,

including the development of a Distant Early Warning line, shared occupancy of key geographic locations, and security plans.

Sub-series 3: Canada-USA Military Cooperation: Sub-Committee on Mapping and Charting
Textual records in Boxes 11, 24 and 30. - 1956-1963.

Administrative History

In 1946 a joint Canadian-United States Basic Security Plan was prepared by the Canada-U.S. Military Co-operation Committee. The plan demanded that arrangements be made for the provision of a programme of air photography and surveys designed to produce the necessary maps and charts, topographic and hydrographic and other information for Canada, Newfoundland and Alaska. The Sub-Committee on Air Photography, Mapping and Charting for Defence was, therefore established in June 1946. The terms of reference were to: determine the areas of Canada and Newfoundland and adjacent waters for which aeronautical and hydrographic charts and topographic maps were essential for defence purposes; to determine the types of maps and charts required for defence purposes; and to study the present Canadian program and formulate a new program which would fulfill all requirements. The Committee's name was changed in March 1947 to the Sub-Committee on Air Photography, Hydrographic Survey, Mapping and Charting for Defence, and again in early 1950 to the Sub-Committee on Mapping and Charting. The terms of reference were revised whereby the Committee were: to provide a program for the production of essential maps, charts and allied materials to meet the requirements emerging from the Canada – United States Basic Security Plan; to insure cooperative effort based on mutual understanding of the common problem and agreed program; and to provide maps and charts required for planning purposes in advance of the actual formation of joint defence plans.

Subseries Description

Sub-series consists of files from the Sub-Committee responsible for mapping and charting locations in North America. Files include plans to photograph the Arctic Islands, as well as plans and priorities for aerial photography in other areas of North America. Also includes maps to identify the status of small, medium and large scale mapping projects.

Subseries Description

Series consists of files regarding Canada's contribution to United Nations missions in the Congo. Includes memoranda and correspondence which largely concentrate on the United Nation's requests for additional aid, and the possibility of Canada providing this support. Also includes reports on the status of Canadian personnel in the Congo.

Topics include Canada's commitments to NATO defence in Europe, as well as its contributions to joint Canada-USA plans to defend North America. The files contain documents that discuss ways in which security and military capabilities can be enhanced to provide better defence, and evaluate Canada's commitment to these plans.

Administrative History

The Post Second World War Division was authorized as part of the Canadian Army Active Force on 16 October 1953. This first peacetime regular division contained the 1st Canadian Infantry Brigade, stationed in Germany, the 2nd at Edmonton and the 3rd at Valcartier. The tour of this division was short-lived and on 5 December 1957 the Minister of National Defence announced in the House of Commons that the divisional headquarters would be reduced to nil strength. On 30 April 1958 the Headquarters of 1st Canadian Infantry Division and its subordinate Headquarters were disbanded.

Subseries Description

Sub-series consists of documents that discuss plans for the 1st Canadian Infantry Division in the event of war or heightened political tensions. Topics include equipment and personnel reserves in Europe, estimated personnel wastage rates, and the logistics required to move the balance of the 1st Canadian Infantry Division to Europe. Administrative History

The North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) is an organization developed to implement the North Atlantic Treaty of 1949, which sought to establish a military counterweight to a Soviet military presence in Europe. It is an alliance based on political and military cooperation among independent member countries., established in accordance with Article 51 of the United Nations Charter. As stated in the preamble to the North Atlantic Treaty, alliance members are committed to safeguarding the freedom, common heritage and civilization of their peoples, founded on the principles of democracy, individual liberty and the rule of law. NATO members include Belgium, Canada, Denmark, France, Germany, Greece, Iceland, Italy, Luxemburg, The Netherlands, Norway, Czech Republic, Spain, Poland, Portugal, Turkey, the United Kingdom and the United States.

Series Description

Series contains files pertaining to NATO defences in the event of an attack. Documents include those from NATO's annual and triennial reviews of defence build-up and reports from NATO's Military Committee on military activities. Also includes documents from the Supreme Headquarters of Allied Powers Europe (SHAPE), which maintained NATO's allied command operations. Files discuss military capabilities and efforts to improve defences against enemy attack, and assess whether current plans are adequate. Files also include documents which evaluate Canada's contribution to NATO defence plans.

The Annual Defence Review was at the core of the International Staff's activities for several years. It evaluated NATO's efforts to improve defences against an enemy attack. The Annual Review required that member countries filled out questionnaires, which were then used to prepare the final report.

Administrative History

The Military Committee (MC) is the senior military authority in NATO and the oldest permanent body in NATO after the North Atlantic Council, both having been formed months after the Alliance came into being. It is the primary source of military advice to NATO's civilian decision-making bodies – the North Atlantic Council and the Nuclear Planning Group - and assists in developing strategic policy and concepts. It also provides guidance to the two Strategic Commanders – Allied Command Operations and Allied Command Transformation. The Military Committee, chaired by the Chairman of the Military Committee, provides an essential link between the political decision-making process and the military structure of NATO. It meets at the level of Military Representatives shortly after meetings of the NAC to follow up on Council decisions, and at the level of Chiefs of Defence Staff three times a year.

Subseries Description

Sub-series consists mainly of annual NATO reports on military activities from the past year and committee meeting minutes from the NATO Military Committee. Also includes progress reports on issues that confronted the Committee.

Sub-series 7: Supreme Headquarters of Allied Powers Europe (SHAPE) Textual records in Boxes 21, 26 and 29. - 1952-1964.

Administrative History

On 18 December 1950, the North Atlantic Council approved the Defence Committee's recommendations for the creation of an integrated European defence force, for the establishment of a Supreme Headquarters in Europe and for the reorganization of the NATO military structure. It also decided that the Supreme Headquarters should be placed under an American officer and requested President Truman to designate General Dwight D. Eisenhower as Supreme Allied Commander (SACEUR), officially appointed on 19 December 1950. It was agreed to establish a Supreme Headquarters in Europe early in 1951 and that SACEUR would be supported by an international staff drawn from the nations contributing to the integrated force. The Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe was set up at Rocquencourt near Paris, France, on 2 April 1951.

On 7 and 8 June 1966, the North Atlantic Council decided to transfer the Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe from France and invited the Benelux countries to provide a new site and, on 30 and 31 March 1967, it moved to its new Headquarters to Casteau Mons in Belgium.

Subseries Description

Sub-series consists of files from SHAPE headquarters, which maintained NATO's allied command operations. Includes recommendations on manpower requirements in Europe, as well as guidelines for member countries to follow when submitting annual reports, including the Equipment and Status Report, and the Combat Readiness and Training Report. Also contains the SHAPE newsletter, a monthly publication which updated member countries on main events, and the SHAPE Public Information Division Newsletter, which contained summaries of articles that appeared in various international newspapers and magazines.
